Fund criteria and guidance for applicants

Miner2Major is a five-year Landscape Partnership scheme (2019-2023), supported by the National Lottery Heritage Fund.

This grants scheme is for groups and organisations to deliver activities that celebrate and conserve the diverse wildlife, important habitats and rich heritage of Sherwood Forest and its communities.

Applying For A Grant

Grants

- Grants are available up to a value of £2,000, with no lower limit
- It would be preferable if you can evidence match funding (other cash funding, volunteer contributions, in kind contributions)
- All projects must reflect at least one of the following outcomes:-
 - 1) A wider range of people are involved within heritage
 - 2) Heritage is identified and better explained
 - 3) People have developed skills
 - 4) People have greater wellbeing
- Projects should be completed within one year of funds being awarded
- Projects must be completed no later than September 2023

Eligibility

- The grants scheme is open to registered charities, constituted community groups and other charitable organisations including Social Enterprises and CICs limited by guarantee in England.
- National organisations with local branches (with their own management committee and bank account) can apply.
- New organisations that can demonstrate they are financially robust can apply

What we will fund

- Projects that take place within the Miner2Major Landscape Partnership area (see Appendix 1).
- We will consider projects that take place outside of the Landscape Partnership area, but that are clearly related to it.
- Projects that are for public benefit and not for private gain.
- Projects that take account of relevant law and other statutory requirements.

What we won't fund

- Existing staff posts or organisational costs.
- Repairs to your own home.
- Legal and/or statutory responsibilities.
- Promoting the causes or beliefs of political or faith organisations.
- Recoverable VAT.

• Costs for any activity that has taken place before a grant is awarded.

Governance

We will ask for the following documents to carry out due diligence on your organisation:

- A copy of your governing document (e.g. constitution, memorandum & articles or set of rules).
- A copy of your most recent annual accounts or management accounts.
- A photocopy of a bank statement no more than 3 months old. The bank account must be in the name of the organisation applying.
- Copies of your safeguarding and equal opportunities policies.

Equal opportunities

You have certain rights when it comes to your personal information. This includes rights to access and correct your information, and to erase, transfer, object to, restrict or take away consent around how we use your information.
